“Minutes of the Meeting”

Chairman Alsop called the regular Board of Supervisors Workshop/Presentation meeting to order. Ms. Alsop noted that all members were present except Mr. Milby.

RESIGNATION OF VICE-CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD JAMES M. MILBY, JR.

Chairman Alsop advised that a letter of resignation as Vice-Chairman of the Board has been received from Mr. Milby, and opened the floor for nominations.

Mr. Bailey nominated Mrs. Morris as Vice-Chairman. Mr. Simpkins moved that the nominations be closed.

Mrs. Morris is now the Vice-Chairman of the Board of Supervisors.

DISCUSSION OF DUNES ORDINANCE

Chairman Alsop advised that a request has been received from the Wetlands Board asking that a Dunes Ordinance be passed in the county. Ms. Alsop noted that a request was received in 2010 and was denied by the Planning Commission. It was reviewed again in 2012 and denied.

County Administrator Thomas Swartzwelder advised that in 2010 the Wetlands Board came and asked staff to present an Ordinance for the Board of Supervisors to adopt. Basically this is the state model Dunes Ordinance which states what can and cannot be done where there are dunes. Without an Ordinance citizens would have to go to Newport News for a hearing which recently

happened to a citizen at the lower end of the County. In 2010 there were no dunes identified by the State in King and Queen. In 2012 there was 1 dune that was identified. Because of the staffing and maintenance of the Dunes Ordinance, it was determined that a Dunes Ordinance was not needed. Mr. Swartzwelder provided a handout of information relating to the request. After discussion, it was the consensus of the Board to table until their next regular meeting in order for the Board to review the said information.

RESOLUTION FOR WEST POINT FIRE AND RESCUE

County Administrator Thomas Swartzwelder advised that West Point Fire and Rescue has provided services to King and Queen County in the lower end for 20+ years and now Lower King and Queen is providing the service. Mr. Swartzwelder commented that he felt it would be appropriate for the Board to consider a Resolution of Appreciation for West Point's services, even though contributions were made to them.

It was the consensus of the Board that a resolution be prepared for the Board's review and that a presentation would be made at a later date.

ZONING ORDINANCE REVIEW

The Board continued their review of proposed changes within the Zoning Ordinance beginning with Article 6.

It is ordered that the Board adjourn their workshop/presentation meeting.
