## **Old Business**

The General Registrar and Chairman of the Electoral Board attended the Board of Supervisors workshop on September 24, 2018 to ask for an additional \$10,000 more in budget for part-time employee compensation.

An updated list of Officers of Election was distributed by the General Registrar.

One thousand ballots will be ordered in additional to the three thousand that has already been ordered for the November 6<sup>th</sup> election.

All Officers of Election has been contacted and confirmed for the training sessions. Three training sessions will be held on October 25, 2018. Chiefs and Assistant Chiefs, 10:00 a.m.-12:00 noon; Officers of Election training, 1:00 p.m.-3:00 p.m. and 4:00 p.m--6:00 p.m. at the King and Queen Courthouse complex.

The Chairman of the Electoral Board visit precinct 201 to look at the pallets of water in the building. To view if the pallets of water will interfere with the flow of the election.

Chairman of the Electoral Board and an Officer of Election will delivery voting equipment to all precincts on November 5<sup>th</sup>. A member of the Sheriff Department will pick up voting equipment and return to the General Registrar's office on election night.

Absentee voting started September 21, 2018. As of October 05, 2018, 4 voters had voted on the machine and 25 ballots received in mail.

The General Registrar's office will be opened two Satursdays preceding the November 7<sup>th</sup> election, October 27<sup>th</sup> and November 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Next meeting will be held November 1, 2018 at 8:30 a.m.
