Minutes of the Meeting

CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

Chairman Bailey called the meeting to order. Roll call was taken with member Doris Morris being absent.

Chairman Bailey advised that the tour of the KQES modular campus would be moved to 6:00 on September 11, 2023 just prior to the regular meeting.

APPROVAL RECURRING WARRANTS

CSA FUNDING UPDATE

Director of Finance Tina Ammons, in her role as Chair of the CPMT, updated the Board on the current CSA case funding. The number of cases has increased significantly as well as the cost of services. This is especially true for private day placements and special needs education services. The CPMT has currently approved funding for some cases for half of the year because the initial approved budget of \$750,000 is not enough to cover the costs recommended by the FAPT. The committee is very aware of the need to be fiscally responsible to the Board and as such wanted her to reach out early even though they still do not know when or if additional funding will be needed. In the event that of changes in the case load, such as a child leaving the county or additional children are identified, the funding need could change. They wanted the Board to be informed early in the process rather than waiting.

Sherrin Alsop expressed concern over a recent social media post that seemed to promote King and Queen as a good place for special education tuition students.

Mr. Burns advised that when he was on the School Board there was a policy not to accept special education students as tuition students, but he does not know if that is still in place. Staff will reach out to Dr. Carter for clarification.

CAPITAL PROJECTS UPDATE

Dane Seagle with Skanska provided an update to the Board on the status of the following projects:

Telework Center – This project has been put out to bid. There have been a few inquiries. A prebid meeting is scheduled for September 6^{th} .

KQES – This project has stalled because of delays from the architect. Mr. Seagle stated that civil engineering documents were due last week and have not been received. In fact, nothing of significance has occurred since April. After general discussion it was the consensus of the Board to have a two-week deadline for the architect to provide biddable documents and to have him present at the September 11, 2023 meeting to give an update on the status of the project. Fire Station – There are still ongoing meetings with EMS staff on needs for the facility. Discussions on the use of the facility are also ongoing. There are still questions on ADA compliance needs, the location of the pharmacy (new state requirement) and other items within the building such as the training tower and an area for drying hoses.

RURAL SOLAR DEVELOPMENT COALITION (RSDC) PROPOSAL

County Administrator Vivian Seay advised that this is a relatively new group that has formed to assist local governments with navigating the solar farm process. Membership is \$5,000 annually but they have offered a 50% discount if she is willing to provide legal services to the group. It was the consensus to join, but with the caveat that they feel that membership should be free because they feel she is more valuable than \$2,500 for the year.

ITEMS BROUGHT FORTH BY BOARD MEMBERS

Sherrin Alsop brought up the following items:

- Asked about the possibility of a data center locating here, that if there is a suitable place, there is the possibility of revenue for the county. This was one of the topics at the Local Officials Summit recently.
- Thanked staff for the update on CSA and asked that they continue to keep the board updated.
- Advised that she has reached out the Senate candidates to get to know them and is also glad to see that Keith Hodges will still be the county's delegate.

Jim Burns brought up the following:

• Asked if staff could make sure that training is provided for the new board members in January. He also asked if they could be provided with a copy of the Supervisors manual and the VDOT manual for supervisors.

Rusty Bailey brought up the following:

• He advised that the county administrator had reached out to him regarding the requirement of her contract to live in the county within 12 months. She has purchase property and is in the process of building but does not think it will be

complete within the required time frame. It was the consensus of the Board that since there has clearly been an effort, that it is not an issue.

PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

Carol Holmes, Stevensville District – She attended the Planning Commission meeting where the proposed mining project on Devils Three Jump Road was discussed. She is opposed to the project and asked the Board to please not approve it.

Marcelus Dungee, Stevensville District – Asked if the Board would be setting the date for the public hearing on the mining project tonight. He is opposed to the project and asked the Board not to approve it.

Julia Redd, Stevensville District – She is opposed to the mining project. The county already has enough trouble with trucks on the road in that area with 'all their foolishness' and making the roads 'all bumped up'. The citizens do not need any more trucks on the roads.

Sandra Burrell, Stevensville District – Expressed that the citizens do not want the mining operation in the Little Plymouth area. There are elderly people and children who attend the church near the site. Please do not approve the mining project.

VDOT UPDATE

No representative was present, but it was noted that they had provided a written report in advance.

SET PUBLIC HEAING DATE – CUP21-02 AND SP21-05 LIESFELD MINING

County Administrator Vivina Seay advised that the applicant has requested a deferral of the public hearing at this time. The Board can still hold the public hearing but delay a decision if they choose to. Mr. Simpkins asked if they gave a reason for the deferral and Ms. Seay responded that she believes that they wish to re-evaluate the proposal based on the outcome at the Planning Commission meeting, but the applicant did not express this in the request. There was discussion regarding the citizens who have come out and are concerned that they deserve to know what is taking place and when.

KQES PROJECT UPDATE

Richard Corner with Hudson Associates presented the Board with new proposed plans for the KQES project. He advised the Board that they have basically been 'sitting on them' since February. Submission was made to DEQ in early February and did not receive comments back until mid-June. This response required significant changes by the civil engineer (TRC) and a new submission was made on August 25th. He has been advised that they have been given an expedited review and are now in the que to be reviewed again. DEQ is aware of the urgency of this project. He has been provided with a letter from DEQ to TRC that was received on Friday the 15th of September with an additional two pages of comments. In response to this Mel Hopkins., project manager with TRC has advised that they may be able to turn around changes to the plan in three weeks as long as they receive comments from Donna Sprouse, Director of Community Development for King and Queen, since receiving comments from the county is part of the requirement for DEQ approval. They will reach out to her tomorrow to see what she needs and what comments she may have. He has provided a link to full sets of plans to the County Administrator as well as the contacts at Skanska. He also has full paper sets available here for members to review if they like. This project has been sitting idle in his office since June due to the civil engineering piece. It has been painstakingly drawn out because of it. He hopes to have a complete document by the end of the month for bidding. They do have a permit in hand for the wastewater/sewer portion, but they do not have well permits because it will be designed post bid. The county can obtain those permits once they have a contract in place. The well will need to be drilled and sampled first in order to determine how the water system will be designed. He has been told it will take approximately four weeks for this design. They will also request costs for drilling the well and they have an estimate of \$80,000.

Earlier in the year, they provided a total project estimate of \$25 to \$26 million. Several things have happened that makes him confident that the project will not deviate from this price. Supply chain concerns are improving, contractors are running out of work. The only concern is with subcontractors. Due to location, the county may have to pay premium contract prices to get good subcontractors. It will be key to get the word out early that the project is coming.

He has reached out to several general contractors and they are interested. The county needs to get the project out to bid and get past DEQ designing the project so it can get started.

Mr. Burns asked if we had biddable documents. Mr. Corner advised that the plans that he has can go out to bid but they are not complete because they do not contain the civil engineering portion. That work would need to be negotiated post bid. In response to another question from Mr. Burns he advised that there is a \$400,000 bid allowance for the water system since it has not been designed yet. That cannot be put out to bid until the well is completed and the system is designed. He has been working with the county administrator on reviewing actual contract documents. There have been some revisions that need to be discussed.

Ms. Seay explained this was tier 1 review and that counsel had been engaged prior to her arrival and she has been in contact with them to do a tier 2 review. It is her intention to review that with the board in a closed meeting.

Mr. Simpkins asked for additional clarification on what documents are missing in the biddable documents. Mr. Corner advised that in addition to the water system, DEQ is holding up the process in obtaining a stormwater permit. The review comments from last week do not contain any 'show stoppers' but they do have items that will affect cost and they don't have county comments. Donna Sprouse has been included in the correspondence and as far as he knows she has what she needs. Having those will enabled a better estimate and a big amendment to the proposal and contractors won't need to reprice. They want to put out the best civil package they can for this project.

Mr. Simpkins asked for clarification on the process of what Ms. Sprouse needs in order to issue her comments.

Ms. Seay clarified that DEQ is the stormwater reviewer and is in charge of stormwater on this project, the county is not. The only involvement the county would have would be erosion and sediment control. It seems odd to her that DEQ would be waiting for comments from the county when they are the authority on this project. Mr. Corner stated that he has seen the comments received from DEQ and they are painfully thorough. Perhaps Ms. Sprouse is waiting to get approval from DEQ before she agrees that the county is okay with things. There are no zoning issues.

For final clarification, Mr. Burns asked if the two-page comment letter had been responded to yet. Mr. Corner advised that it had not. There is approximately two weeks' worth of work to be done in order to respond and then possibly more time if DEQ has more comments. But he is hopeful that it would be turned around quickly.

Mr. Burns expressed concern that it would be done quickly since the last submission took from June to August. With an even bigger delay from February to June.

Mr. Bailey stated that it is a shame that it has taken DEQ this long to approve this project, but they can approve the liner for the landfill in 30 days.

Board members made the suggestion that maybe the county needs to get their delegates and senators involved to help move things along.

Mr. Corner closed his comments with the statement that he is confident that the project is moving forward now and is hopeful that it will continue to do so. He left full scale copies of the plans and specs for board members and staff.

- Advised the Board that due to some of the capital projects underway as well as
 other operating expenses that have come up that were not budgeted for, a public
 hearing may need to be held later for a budget amendment.
- o The EDA approved the engagement of the Timmons Group to do a site analysis of potential economic development throughout the county. This will include the sites held by the EDA as well as privately held properties. This will assist economic development staff in targeting appropriate businesses and areas.
- Provided the Board with Riverstreet brochures to promote to citizens.
 Construction of the fiber infrastructure is complete, and they are now hooking up customers throughout the county. Mr. Burns commented that the crews that are doing hook ups are 'Johnny on the spot' doing the install and even if there is damage. They provide very good customer service.
- o The new website will be live soon. There will be meetings with department heads for making final tweaks to content and layout.

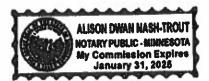
